

Information About Physician Badge Scanning

Every attendee in the SAM 2020 Podiatric Physician program will receive a scanning name badge upon check-in at the SAM registration desk. For Physicians, this badge will need to be scanned at the designated scanning times listed on page 7 of this program to determine exact duration and assign Continuing Education Contact Hours (CECH) accordingly.

Scanning units will be located as indicated on the Physician Continuing Education Contact Hours (CECH) Information on page 7 of this program. **Attendees will be awarded CECH for the lectures for which their badge is scanned.**

IMPORTANT: A log will be posted in the registration area each day for Physicians to review their earned hours and submit corrections, if necessary. It is best to verify your CECH information is correct while you are on-site at the conference, rather than after the conference has ended.

Total CECH will be calculated from the scanning name badges that each Physician uses to scan. These hours will be submitted to CE Broker by FPMA once the conference is over, all hours have been verified, and, for FPMA members, all 2019 membership dues have been paid in full. Florida Podiatric Physicians can view these hours via their CE Broker account at www.cebroker.com. Podiatric Physicians from other states will be sent certificates showing total CECH earned by attending SAM 2020.

SAM attendees will be awarded up to 25.0 Continuing Education Contact Hours, depending on tracks attended. Continuing Education Contact Hours (CECH) are calculated hour-per-hour based on courses attended (time taken for breaks and meals are NOT counted); e.g., a 30 minute Science lecture will earn 0.5 Science credit hours, a one-hour Science lecture will earn 1.0 Science credit hours, a 1.5 hour Practice Management lecture will earn 1.5 PM credit hours, etc.

All licensees who seek to renew the active status of their licensure must demonstrate that they have completed, during the previous two years, at least forty (40) hours of continuing education, including the following categories:

- At least one (1) of the forty (40) hours must concern the topic of Risk Management.
- At least one (1) of the forty (40) hours must be on the subject of Laws and Rules.
- At least two (2) of the forty (40) hours must be on the subject of prevention of Medical Errors.
- While not required, licensees may complete up to three (3) hours of continuing education per biennium in the area of Practice Management.
- The remainder of the hours can be made up of Scientific hours.

A new continuing education requirement for Podiatric Physicians in Florida was recently implemented by the Florida Legislature. Podiatric Physicians must complete a 1-hour board-approved course on Human Trafficking. Completion of this course is required by January 1, 2021.

Accreditation Information

Podiatric Physician Accreditation Statement: FPMA has approved this activity for a maximum of 25 Continuing Education Contact Hours (CECH) during this five-day conference, depending on lectures attended.

In accordance with the Council on Podiatric Medical Education (CPME), FPMA is required to monitor educational session attendance for verification of CECH. Scanning badges and a scanning schedule will be provided to each SAM 2020 Physician and X-Ray Assistant attendee when they check in at the conference.

CECH functions are for registered attendees only. CECH credits are based on attendance of educational sessions; sessions specified as "Non-CECH" in the conference program are not included in compiling CECH credits.

FPMA will provide attendees with a Certificate of Attendance that reflects only the number of CECH documented via their scanning badge records. CECH will be reported to CE Broker on behalf of SAM 2020 Physician and X-Ray Assistant attendees currently licensed in the state of Florida. Each attendee is responsible for reporting attendance to all appropriate boards and agencies requiring continuing education by providing a copy of their SAM 2020 Certificate of Attendance.

Certificate of Attendance: To ensure FPMA continues to provide a meaningful educational program and exceptional conference experience, FPMA requests all attendees complete an overall conference evaluation prior to receiving their Certificate of Attendance. Attendees will receive an email from FPMA with a link to complete the overall conference evaluation within three (3) weeks of the conclusion of the conference, pending all conference fees being paid and attendance verified by FPMA. The Certificate of Attendance will be provided for printing/downloading in PDF format once the overall conference evaluation is completed.

Continuing Education and Credentialing: The Florida Podiatric Medical Association (FPMA) is approved by the Council on Podiatric Medical Education (CPME) as a provider of continuing education in podiatric medicine.
