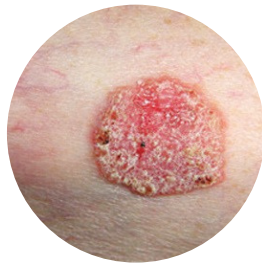

ACCREDITATION INFORMATION

Podiatric Physician Accreditation Statement: The Florida Podiatric Medical Association (FPMA) is approved by the Council on Podiatric Medical Education (CPME) as a provider of continuing education in podiatric medicine. FPMA has approved this activity for a maximum of 14.0 Continuing Education Contact Hours (CECH) during this four-day conference, depending on lectures attended. This conference will take place June 8 - 11, 2023 at the Hyatt Regency Coconut Point Resort and Spa in Bonita Springs, Florida.

In accordance with the CPME, FPMA is required to monitor educational session attendance for verification of CECH. Badges for attendance verification will be provided to each 2023 Summer Conference Physician and X-Ray Assistant attendee when they check in at the conference.

CECH functions are for registered attendees only. CECH credits are based on attendance of educational sessions; sessions specified as “Non-CECH” in the conference program are not included in compiling CECH credits.

FPMA will provide attendees with a Certificate of Attendance that reflects only the number of CECH documented via their attendance verification records. CECH will be reported to CE Broker on behalf of 2023 Summer Conference Physician and X-Ray Assistant attendees currently licensed in the state of Florida. Each attendee is responsible for reporting attendance to all appropriate boards and agencies requiring continuing education by providing a copy of their 2023 Summer Conference Certificate of Attendance.

Certificate of Attendance: To ensure FPMA continues to provide a meaningful educational program and exceptional conference experience, FPMA requests all attendees complete an overall conference evaluation prior to receiving their Certificate of Attendance. Attendees will receive an email from FPMA with a link to complete an overall conference evaluation within three (3) weeks of the conclusion of the conference, pending all conference fees being paid and attendance verified by FPMA. The Certificate of Attendance will be provided for printing/downloading in PDF format once the overall conference evaluation is completed.

Cost to the Learner: FPMA 2023 Summer Conference attendees paid a range of registration fees based on their current membership status in APMA and/or FPMA as well as the date they registered for the conference (the various registration fees were provided in the FPMA 2023 Summer Conference Physician registration form). Non-APMA/FPMA members paid the full registration fee of \$349 (by April 25, 2023) or \$399 (after April 25, 2023).

ATTENDANCE VERIFICATION (cont.)

General Information

Total CECH will be calculated from each physician's attendance verification records. These hours will be submitted to CE Broker by FPMA at the conclusion of the conference and once all hours have been verified. Florida Podiatric Physicians can view these hours via their CE Broker account at www.cebroker.com. Podiatric Physicians from other states will be sent certificates showing total CECH earned by attending the FPMA 2023 Summer Conference.

FPMA 2023 Summer Conference physician attendees will be awarded up to 14.0 Continuing Education Contact Hours (CECH), depending on lectures attended. Continuing Education Contact Hours are calculated hour-per-hour based on courses attended (time taken for breaks and meals are NOT counted); e.g., a 30 minute Science lecture will earn 0.5 Science credit hours, a one-hour Science lecture will earn 1.0 Science credit hours, a 1.5 hour Practice Management lecture will earn 1.5 PM credit hours, etc.

All physician licensees who seek to renew the active status of their licensure must demonstrate that they have completed, during the previous two years, at least forty (40) hours of continuing education, including the following categories:

- At least one (1) of the forty (40) hours must concern the topic of Risk Management.
- At least one (1) of the forty (40) hours must be on the topic of Laws and Rules.
- At least two (2) of the forty (40) hours must be on the subject of prevention of Medical Errors.
- At least two (2) of the forty (40) hours must be on Prescribing Controlled Substances.
- While not required, licensees may complete up to three (3) hours of continuing education per biennium in the area of Practice Management.
- The remainder of the hours can be made up of Scientific hours.

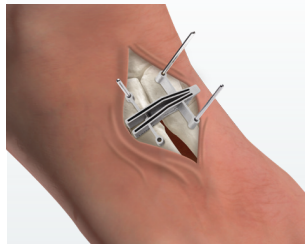

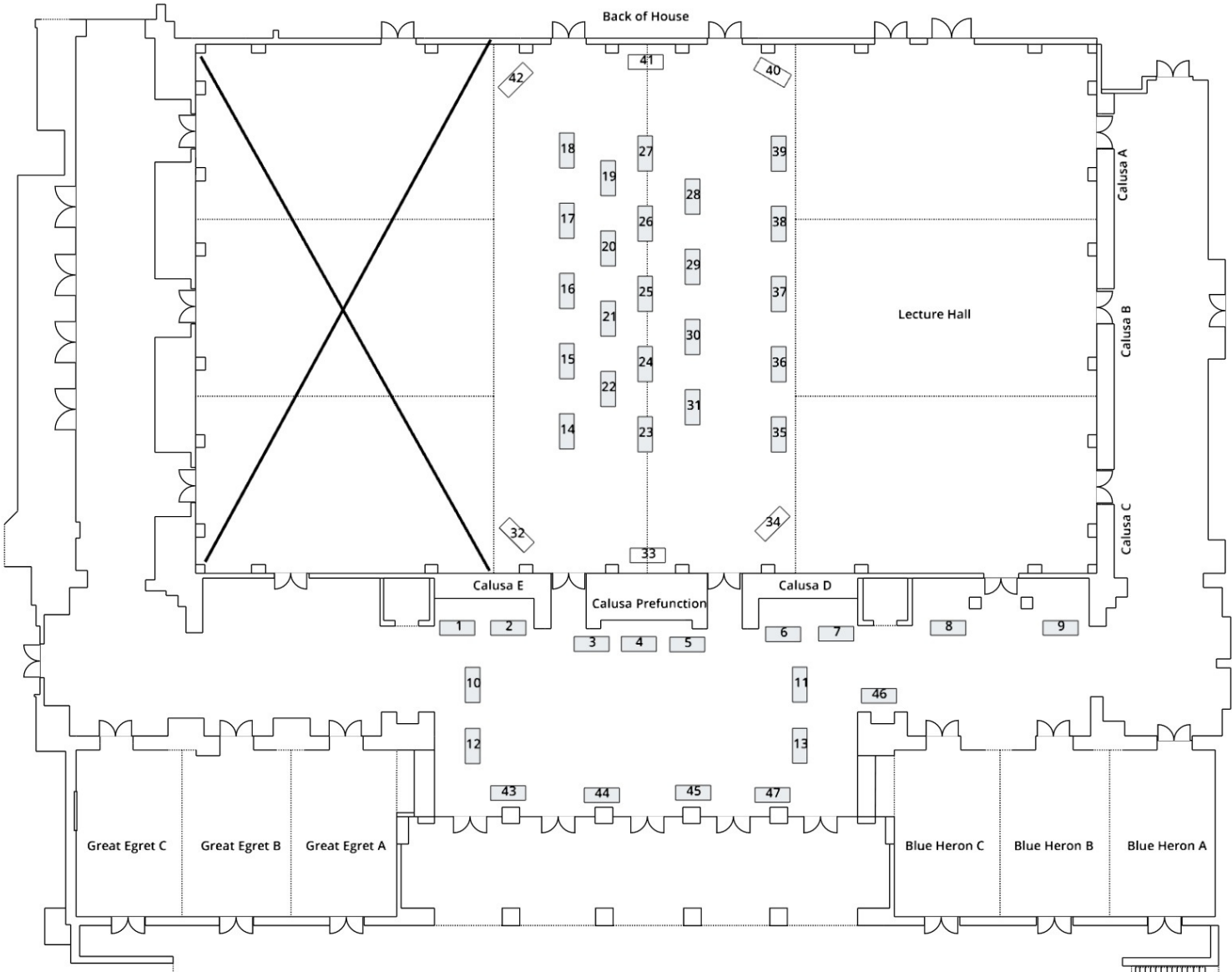
