
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# IMPORTANT INFORMATION



# **ACCREDITATION INFORMATION**

**Podiatric Physician Accreditation Statement:** The Florida Podiatric Medical Association (FPMA) is approved by the Council on Podiatric Medical Education (CPME) as a provider of continuing education in podiatric medicine. FPMA has approved this activity for a maximum of **14.0** Continuing Education Contact Hours (CECH) during this three-day conference, depending on lectures attended. This conference will take place June 6 - 8, 2025 at the Hyatt Regency Coconut Point Resort in Bonita Springs, Florida.

In accordance with the CPME, FPMA is required to monitor educational session attendance for verification of CECH. QR Codes for attendance verification will be accessible to 2025 Summer Conference Physician attendees when they attend breaks in the conference Exhibit Hall. 2025 Summer Conference X-Ray Assistants will be required to sign a sign-in sheet while attending the X-Ray Assistant program.


