Podiatric Physicians Now Authorized to Administer the COVID-19 Vaccine



# **FPMA Alert**

April 6, 2021

The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) issued new guidance on March 12, 2021 to expand the pool of qualified professionals able to serve as COVID-19 vaccinators.

Under the Public Readiness and Emergency Preparedness Act (PREP Act), additional qualified vaccine providers will now include Podiatric Physicians.

To become a COVID-19 vaccine provider, your practice or organization must be enrolled in the Florida State Health Online Tracking System (Florida SHOTS) and the Vaccines for Children/Adults Program (VFC/VFA).

### **Providers Authorized to Administer the COVID-19 Vaccine**

The list below contains health care professions whose governing practice act or federal guidance authorizes the administration of vaccines, including COVID-19 vaccines.

More information about the PREP Act and requirements to administer the COVID-19 vaccine for health care practitioners authorized under this guidance can be found at <a href="PHE.gov">PHE.gov</a>. Some of the requirements include:

 Documentation of completion of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention COVID-19 Vaccine Training Modules,

- Documentation of an observation period by a currently practicing health care professional experienced in administering intramuscular injections, and
- Current certificate in basic cardiopulmonary resuscitation.

### **COVID-19 Vaccine Reporting Requirements**

Florida Department of Health, Emergency Rule <u>64DER21-4</u>, Florida Administrative Code, requires all enrolled COVID-19 vaccine providers to report vaccination data in <u>Florida SHOTS</u> within **24 hours** of administration. This emergency rule follows Emergency Rule 64DER20-43, Florida Administrative Code, which expired March 14, 2021. The following data elements are required when reporting:

(1) Administered at location: facility name/ID	(12) MVX (manufacturer)
(2) Administered at location: type	(13) Recipient address
(3) Administration address (including county)	(14) Recipient date of birth
(4) Administration date	(15) Recipient name
(5) CVX (Product)	(16) Recipient sex
(6) Dose number	(17) Sending organization
(7) IIS recipient ID	(18) Vaccine administering provider suffix
(8) Recipient race	(19) Vaccine administering site (on the body)
(9) Recipient ethnicity	(20) Vaccine expiration date
(10) IIS vaccination event ID	(21) Vaccine route of administration
(11) Lot number: unit of use and/or unit of sale	(22) Vaccination series complete

### **How Can I Become a COVID-19 Vaccine Provider?**

To become a COVID-19 vaccine provider, your practice or organization must be enrolled in the Florida State Health Online Tracking System (Florida SHOTS) and the Vaccines for Children/Adults Program (VFC/VFA).
