FPAC is the Florida State recognized independent arm of FPMA, created to provide financial support to bipartisan candidates for the Florida House and Senate. These officials decide how Podiatric Medicine is practiced in Florida.

What does this mean to you?

It is our means of concentrating our political capital.

The PAC enables us to focus and collectively mobilize our efforts on your behalf.

Why should you care?

Your contributions make it possible for us to make legislators cognizant of the full scope of education, training, and experience of Podiatric Physicians practicing in the State of Florida.

Your contributions make it possible for us to influence current bills, including any willing provider limitations on opioid prescriptions, opioid CME requirements, and the unfair request by insurance companies for post-payment refunds.

The opportunity to contribute to the FPAC is included in your FPMA dues statement. Our livelihood and podiatric profession depends on it.
